# **OUR IMPACT**

Xavier Mission runs five programs year-round providing food, clothing, trauma-informed care, and financial assistance to our neighbors who face challenging circumstances.

### BASIC HUMAN NEEDS

The **CLOTHING ROOM** provides clean casual and professional clothing and toiletries. For the last 1.5 years, we have been serving new populations, including women, children, and refugees.





The **CUSTOMER-CHOICE FOOD PANTRY** provides groceries to guests in a shopping-style environment. We deliver groceries to seniors and homebound individuals who are unable to visit.

The **WELCOME TABLE SOUP KITCHEN** provides hot meals each Sunday. Additional services include health screenings, benefit referrals, assistance in obtaining documents, and flu shots.



### **EMPOWERMENT & SELF-SUFFICIENCY**



The LIFE-SKILLS EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMS (LSEP) provide life-skills training, mentoring, a trauma-informed support group and storytelling, and supportive services to people who have experienced complex trauma.

The FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (FAP) provides payment of rent arrears to New Yorkers facing eviction, as well as assistance with other critical expenses, including utilities, medical bills, and transportation, to help families achieve stability.

# WELCOME TABLE









The Welcome Table offers more than just meals—it provides connection, dignity, and a sense of belonging. Every Sunday, hundreds gather not only for nourishment but for a community that sees and values them. In 2024, as food insecurity reached alarming levels, we served 55,000 meals, ensuring that 500 people each week found comfort and support at our table.

Beyond the meal, the Welcome Table fosters care and creativity through partnerships like that with the Unframed Arts Collective, where guests can express themselves freely and process their trauma through art. High School students also started a nail polish station, where a fresh coat of color becomes a small but meaningful act of self-care. It's these personal touches that make the Welcome Table a place where guests feel seen, valued, and respected.

For Elliott, the Welcome Table was life-changing. "I'm one of those people who came here for a meal and ended up with a job. I would still come back here regardless. It serves a purpose and a higher need. It's about humanity here. You're treated like a human." Once a guest struggling with homelessness, Elliott is now a proud member of the Xavier Mission team, proving that with dignity and opportunity, transformation is possible.

The Welcome Table is more than a program—it's a lifeline.

### Unlock the Power of Your Giving: A Path to Greater Impact!

In the world of philanthropy, Donor Advised Funds (DAFs) are incredible tools—much like treasure chests filled with potential, waiting to be shared. However, while DAFs offer a unique way to manage and direct giving, sometimes the resources within them remain untapped, while nonprofits like ours are actively working to address pressing needs.

Imagine this: You're leading a team at a soup kitchen, preparing hot meals for families facing food insecurity. You have the kitchen, the volunteers, and the plans. But the food? In the U.S., there is no mandatory payout requirement for DAFs in the same way there is for private foundations. Donors are able to receive tax benefits as soon as they deposit money in DAFs, even if the money is not distributed for charitable purposes. Over \$200 billion is currently estimated to be sitting inactive in DAFs, while organizations like Xavier Mission vie for limited foundation funding and struggle to provide services as needs increase.




